Title: An act to provide greater assistance to refugees and amputees currently residing in displacement camps.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Sierra Leone, from 1991-2002, was engaged in an armed civil war between the Revolutionary United Front (RUF) and the government. The RUF committed extreme atrocities such as forcing children to fight for them and amputation of citizens. These amputees still live in amputee camps that often have a low quality of life. Thousands of refugees are displaced in refugee camps from Liberia and other countries with civil wars currently going on. These camps very rarely offer food and necessities. Hospitals and first aid are rare because of lack of skilled people in these camps.

Section I: This proposal will provide greater food and health care assistance to refugees and amputees in camps. The United Nations would provide assistance to these camps. The World Food Programme would increase their distribution of food in camps. UNICEF will also help children and their families by offering counseling services.

Section II: Funding would be provided by the United Nations World Food Programme and UNICEF.

Section III: Amount distributed will be determined by the number of people in the camp and will be determined by camp supervisors. The World Health Organization will provide the trained doctors and nurses, as well as counselors.

Section IV: Reports will be filed by camp supervisors and delivered to sponsoring programs to assess needs and successes.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect within three months of identification of needed volunteers, not to exceed six months.
