Title: An act to promote healthy lifestyles and clean water supplies by implementing sanitary education programs in addition to providing fresh water wells.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

Sudan faces ecological crises like water scarcity and significant illnesses and fatalities due to the exposure of bacteria found in contaminated water. Rural Sudanese are displaced often by changing landscapes, a lack of agricultural production, and civil war. As these displaced individuals migrate throughout the country in search of a place to settle, the demand for water increases, but its availability to the country's inhabitants continually remains low. Access to clean water is needed however many Southern Sudanese continue to suffer due to a lack of this valuable resource.

Section I: Water should be supplied to each village through the construction of a fresh water well that will be located within a three mile radius in hopes that individuals will not be required to walk for miles in search of fresh water. Proposals have been made to the United Nations to get donations for missions in Ethiopia and Eritrea. Following in their foot steps, our proposal will be submitted to the funding council for our programs and wells. The general pricing for a well is \$12 per foot to install not to exceed \$10,000.

Section II: In this program we not only want to provide wells but to also educate the citizens of South Sudan on the importance of water quality and cleanliness. We specifically want to focus on educating the people of Sudan on the bacteria in water and how to improve public health. In addition, when the unsanitary water gets into their system they often become sick sometimes leading to death. So, we want to teach how to identify bacteria in water. This program will also be submitted in the proposal to the United Nations to get funding for our program. The program we will use will be The water Project. This program already has the class supplied to a few villages but we want to make it mandatory for each village to attend this class and have a well.

Section III: The amount of people in the village will determine when a village gets help or materials. Larger populated villages have greater need and will therefore be made top priority. Also, the wells will be placed in between close proximity villages for joint use.

Section IV: This bill will go into effect immediately. One month after the program has started and wells are in place every village will be checked to make sure all is going well. Money will also be spent to train a core group of people in each village to help maintain and monitor the well.
