Title: **An act to start a prototype safe house for children within Thailand.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Every year in Thailand alone approximately 80,000 women and children are trafficked. Since Thailand serves as a major import and export country this increases the percentage of child trafficking along its border. The surrounding countries of Thailand face similar problems with human and child trafficking.

Section I: We want to create a prototype safe house for victims of child trafficking and those that are currently being trafficked. They will not only be provided with a safe place to stay but will be given the opportunity to talk to on-site counselors to begin to heal emotionally. Also, it is goal to help the children reconnect with their family.

Section II: The safe house would take in any child under the age of 20 (Thailand's age of adulthood) who has been rescued from a raid, escaped child trafficking on their own, or is found living on the streets.

Section III: To create this safe house we will be seeking financial assistance from UNICEF, other countries, accepting charitable donations.

Section IV: After 5 years the following criteria will be looked at to see the success of the prototype and if it should be implemented in other countries: how many children were served in the safe house, the survival rates of the children rescued from child trafficking, and the improvement in the children's mental/emotional well-being.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect 6 months after passage, that time being used to gather financial resources. Within 12 months the safe house should be established.
