Title: An act to work with Turkey and the neighboring countries to provide better living conditions for millions of civil war refugees fleeing from Syria.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Turkey, Jordan and the other surrounding countries are trying to provide aid for the 500,000 refugees fleeing the Syrian civil war without being drawn into the Syrian conflict. In a 24-hour period, 1,300 Syrians fled to Turkey, and in August alone, 80,000 fled to Turkey. Most of the refugee camps are overcrowded tented cities with harsh living conditions and not enough food. Compounding the problem is the resentment of the Turkish citizens having the refugees, 75% of which are women and children, depending on them for aid.

Section I: The United Nations shall ratify this proposal by creating the following programs.

Section II: Provide food, clothing, and medical assistance to the refugees.

Section III: Increase security at the borders to organize and streamline the arrival of refugees arriving in Turkey and the surrounding countries

Section IV: Educate the children in the refugee camp by helping to build an elementary and secondary school.

Section V: Train the adult refugees through a job corps program to learn job skills so they can be more self-sufficient while in their camp, as well as when they return to Syria.

Section VI: Keep the UN Human Rights Council informed of progress or lack of progress.
