1 An act to increase the age of persons able to buy tobacco products from 18 years to 21 years.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: Currently 68% of smokers began smoking when they were 18 or younger. Each day across the
6 United States , more than 3800 youth under age 18 smoke their first cigarette.
7
8 Section 2: A hot line will be established where citizens can anonymously call and report businesses that are
9 selling tobacco products.
10
11 Section 3: Businesses that get caught selling tobacco products to persons under 21 years of age will be
12 fined.
13 1st offense - 500.00
14 2nd offense - 1000.00
15 3rd offense - 2000.00
16
17 After the third offense businesses will loose their tobacco license.
18
19 Money generated from the fines will be used for PSA on the health risk of smoking.
20
21 Section 4: This bill will go into effect immediately after passage.
