- 1 An act to establish life skills courses as part of the middle / secondary school curriculum.
2
- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
- 5 Section 1: Life skills courses will be established in every middle and secondary school in all counties across
6 Kentucky.
7
- 8 Section 2: These courses will teach conflict management, money management (check writing, balancing,
9 banking), and career education.
10
- 11 Section 3: Professionals will check the programs and get feedback from teachers and students from time to
12 time.
13
- 14 Section 4: In ten years, if post-graduation success rates show improvement, the classes will become a
15 requirement in middle and secondary schools.
16
- 17 Section 5: This bill shall go into effect by August 2015. Schools will have until the beginning of the 2015
18 school year to implement the classes. Inspections will begin November of that year.
