- 1 An act to regulate state insurance policies to cover genetic testing and counseling

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: Once a diagnosis is made, insurance companies must include coverage on follow-up and
- 6 treatment.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: If a patient is screened for BRCA1 and/or BRCA 2 gene, which identifies many diseases,
- 9 coverage is required.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: The Center for Disease Control and its advisory groups will regulate insurance companies for
- 12 compliance.
- 13
- 14 Section 4: Non-compliance or violation will result in Medicare discontinuing reimbursement of funds.
- 15
- 16 Section 5: This bill will go into effect 2 years upon passage.
