- 1 An act to apply random drug testing to high school athletes before/during tournament games.  
2
- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
4
- 5 Section 1: Using a blood/urine testing kit, student athletes will be tested before tournament games.  
6
- 7 Section 2: KHSAA (KY High School Athletic Association) trained volunteers will administer the testing.  
8
- 9 Section 3: 1st offense: suspension from the tournament and must attend a drug education class  
10 2nd offense: expulsion from all high school athletic teams  
11 schools may determine other consequences (suspension, etc.)  
12
- 13 Section 4: Schools will offer fundraising for drug testing.  
14
- 15 Section 5: Upon passage, this bill will go into effect the following school year.
