1 An act to implement a required recycling program in all public schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section I: Over 80 percent of a school’s waste is recyclable; however the average school creates 5,000
6 pounds of waste a month. This bill will assist schools in implementing a school-wide recycling program that
7 will help the environment, while also being more cost efficient to the schools.

9 Section II: All public schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky will implement a school-wide recycling
10 program. Schools will be required to recycle all plastic, paper, and aluminum products, along with other items
11 of the school’s choice. Each school will be responsible for creating their own school-wide recycling
12 implementation plan.

14 Section III: All public schools will be required to implement a school-wide recycling program.

15

16 Section IV: Each school will be required to provide funding for the implementation of the school-wide
17 recycling program that they chose.

18

19 Section V: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year.
