1 An act to ban all hydraulic fracturing in Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1:Hydraulic fracturing companies will be given a minimum of 30 days to clean up and leave the site.

7 Section 2:This bill will cost roughly \$20,000,000 to find research of new energy sources as well as requiring
8 landfills in Kentucky to extract methane.

10 Section 3: This bill will be funded by increased tax revenue - taxes will be increased by 1% for families
11 making \$50,000 dollars or less, 3% for families making between \$50,000 and \$100,000, and 5% for
12 families making over \$100,000.

13
14 Section 4: Tax money will be earmarked for solar, wind, charging stations (for electric cars), hydro electric,
15 and bioenergy sources for cleaner energy.

16
17 Section 5: This bill will take effect immediately upon passage.
