1 An act to establish limits on certain chemicals in food.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: Limits will be established on certain chemicals in order to improve the health of those living in the
6 Commonwealth of Kentucky.

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8 Section 2: A three year time period will be given to companies to remove those specific chemicals.

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10 Section 3: After the three years, a warning will be given to companies in violation and they will have two
11 months to comply or be fined an amount equal to 1% of their income.

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13 Section 4: If companies remain in noncompliance two months after the warning, the fine will be increased by
14 an additional 1%.

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16 Section 5: The ban will include, but not be limited to, chemicals like BHT, BHA, and artificial sweeteners.

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18 Section 6: Funds to pay the inspectors will be provided by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Fines collected
19 by the noncompliant companies will go directly into that state fund.

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21 Section 7: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby considered null and void.

23 Section 8: This bill shall go into effect by January 1, 2014.
