1 An act to establish limits on certain chemicals in food.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Limits will be established on certain chemicals in order to improve the health of those living in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Section 2: A three year time period will be given to companies to remove those specific chemicals.

Section 3: After the three years, a warning will be given to companies in violation and they will have two months to comply or be fined an amount equal to 1% of their income.

Section 4: If companies remain in noncompliance two months after the warning, the fine will be increased by an additional 1%.

Section 5: The ban will include, but not be limited to, chemicals like BHT, BHA, and artificial sweeteners.

Section 6: Funds to pay the inspectors will be provided by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Fines collected by the noncompliant companies will go directly into that state fund.

Section 7: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby considered null and void.

Section 8: This bill shall go into effect by January 1, 2014.
