1 An act to require public high schools to offer an elective 9 week safety course.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: All public high schools must offer a safety course as an elective. This course will include self-  
6 defense, CPR training, Heimlich Maneuver, how to prevent and prepare against home crisis(fires, gas leaks,  
7 ingesting toxins), and child care

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9 Section 2: The implementation of this bill will be overseen by the Kentucky Department of Education.

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11 Section 3: The school health teacher will teach this course and must be certified to teach CPR and self  
12 defense.

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14 Section 4: The health teacher's salary will be dependent on the school boards decision.

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16 Section 5: The course will be offered as an elective , or each school's equivalent to an elective.

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18 Section 6: This bill will go into effect at the start of the 2015-2016 school year.
