1 An act to provide vouchers to all students in public schools that meet the criteria
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: A school voucher is a certificate that helps fund the expenses of students changing schools from
6 a state school to a private school or the other way around. This fund is issued by the state government.
7 Kentucky is one of only 10 states that haven't passed legislation to fund vouchers.
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9 Section 2: The way we receive the money to implement this bill is, the government will use money already
10 there from property tax.

12 Section 3: The Kentucky Department of Education will create a new cabinet to oversee the voucher process.
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14 If the student is eligible, then the school the student wants to go to will be contacted and the head
15 administrators there will make a final decision. If a student is ruled ineligible, he may appear.
16
17 Section 4: The school voucher will be given to students with: special needs, low income, disabilities,
18 extraordinary talents, students who don't want to go to a failing school, students who get bullied, and
19 students with religious issues. They have to meet requirements set by the school that they want to attend as
20 well.

22 Section 5: This will come into law December 2014
