1                                   An act to increase penalties for people that promote human trafficking.

3                                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Currently, human trafficking is a class D felony that carries a sentence of up to 8 years  
6 depending on the severity of the crime. We propose jail time increases for people that are convicted of  
7 promoting human trafficking.

8  
9 If the victim is 18 years old or older the promoter can be sentenced for up to 10 years and must be  
10 registered as a sex offender for 15 years.

11  
12 If the victim is under 18 years old the promoter can be sentenced for up to 20 years and must be registered  
13 as a sex offender for 30 years.

14  
15 If gross bodily harm occurs an additional sentence of up to 5 years can be given.

16  
17 Section 2: Local law agencies will enforce this bill and be expected to collaborate with state and federal  
18 agencies to convict multiple offenders.

19  
20 Section 3: Once convicted, human traffickers will also be fined. The money collected through the fines will be  
21 used to provide rehabilitation services to the victims.

22  
23 Section 4: This bill will go into effect immediately after passage.
