1 An act to require the citizens of Kentucky over the age of 75 to retake their drivers test ever 2 years.

2  
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4  
5 Section 1: In order to reduce the number of accidents and fatalities on Kentucky's roadways, we are  
6 requiring that any drivers 75 and older retake their driver's test every 2 years. The number of elderly drivers  
7 in Kentucky is increasing, and these drivers alter their driving habits to compensate for their declining  
8 capabilities. Six percent of the drivers in Kentucky are 75 and older, and half of those were in a collision in  
9 2012.

11 Section 2: Citizens must take the physical driving test within three month of turning 75. They may retake  
12 the driving test as many times as needed, but they can only take the driving test once each calendar month.  
13 If they fail the test, their license will be suspended until they pass it.

15 Section 3: If the driving test is failed, or they are involved in at-fault accident, they will have option of  
16 attending drivers' school offered through the Department of Motor Vehicles. They will be required to  
17 complete a 12 hour course. One month after the course is completed they are eligible to take the driver's  
18 portion of the test.

20 Section 4: Penalties driving on a suspended or revoked license is a Class B misdemeanor which results in a  
21 fine up to \$250.00 and up to 90 days in jail. Second offense within five years is a Class A misdemeanor  
22 which results in a fine up to \$500.00 and up to 1 year in jail. Third offense will result in Class D felony with  
23 fines between \$1,000.00 and \$10,000.00 and up to 5 years in prison.

25 Section 5: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2015.
