1 2 3	An act to improve Education in the state of Kentucky by allowing students to be Home Schooled based on low test scores and still play sports at the Public School.
4 5	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
6 7 8 9	Section 1:If a School District is not providing an appropriate education (District is in the bottom 20% of School Districts as measured on State Assessment unless obtaining a Distinguished Label) a student may be home schooled and still be eligible to play sports at the public school in the district in which they reside.
10 11	Section 2: If a student played a sport in the previous year before being home schooled they will automatically make the team so that discrimination may be ruled out.
12 13 14 15 16	Section 3:Home schooled student must meet the same requirements that a public school student must meet to remain on the team. This includes appropriate behavior standards, academic standards, practice standards and game standards.
17 18 19	Section 4: When the School District elevates their test scores above the bottom 20% a Home Schooled Student will not be allowed to play sports at the public school as long as they stay in the top 80%.
20 21 22 23	Section 5: Any School District found to be in violation of this Law will be penalized by having all sports programs suspended for one school year.
23 24 25	Section 6: Any expense that may be occurred will be covered by the School District in which this law is affecting.
26	Section 7: This law will be enacted for the 2014–15 school year.
