An act to require coal burning power plants to properly dispose of coal waste.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: the definition of coal waste is: any unusable byproduct that is created as a result of the coal burning process.

Section 2: Companies this bill would affect will include any coal companies that produce coal waste in Kentucky.

Section 3: To properly dispose of coal waste it must be buried at a municipal solid waste landfill or buried at the site of burning. If buried at the site you must do the following:

- Submit special waste request that provides ground water depth, legal description, distance from surface water, and the land use of the disposal location.
- Dig a trench that measures 4 feet to 10 feet by 10 feet to 20 feet long.
- Put a plastic bottom liner that is 20 millimeters wide.
- Cover the sheet with 6 inches of fine dirt to prevent puncture of the sheet.
- The coal waste is then placed in the trench and another plastic liner put on top.
- It is then covered with 2 feet of dirt and then grated to facilitate water runoff.

Section 4: The Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection is responsible for enforcing this law.

Section 5: A noncompliance for 30 days after a given notice results in a fine of \$25,000. Noncompliance after 60 days shall result in a fine of \$100,000 dollars. Noncompliance in excess of sixty days shall result in a \$10,000 fine for every three days thereafter.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2015.
