1 An act to allow teachers to possess hand-held firearms in their classrooms.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Currently there is no law allowing teachers in KY to keep hand-held firearms in their
6 classrooms. Our bill will help KY schools have a safer environment.

8 Section 2: Types of weapons: 9 mm, pistol, revolver, & glock.

9

10 Section 3: Training: Training and lock boxes for the weapons will be paid for by funding from state taxes.
11 Since training takes about two days, teachers could complete this on their own time. This is an option for
12 teachers if they want to do so. The training course will just be a basic firearm safety course as well.

13

14 Section 4: Storage of Weapon: The weapon will be stored in a lock box in a locked cabinet in each classroom.
15 A locked cabinet will be supplied for any teacher who doesn't already have one. The expenses will be for the
16 lock boxes, training, and cabinets if needed.

18 Section 5: Funding: Funding will come from state taxes. It will go towards lock boxes, training, and cabinets
19 if needed.

20

21 Section 6: The State Police will supervise the training for all teachers who decide to take the course.
22 Afterwards they will check the weapon purchased for the classroom to make sure it is safe and the correct
23 one.

24

25 Section 7: This bill will go into effect July 1, 2014.
