1 2 3	An act to require all plans for new school construction to include a school-wide safe room for disasters and/or emergencies.
4 5	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
6 7 8 9	Section 1: The purpose of this bill is for schools to create a safe room similar to an underground auditorium where schools can go when disasters occur. These disasters may be school shootings, tornadoes, hurricanes, etc. These rooms will be underground and accessible from every classroom.
10 11 12 13	Section 2: On average, 3 deaths occur in Kentucky annually due to tornadoes. Even more are lost nationally to school shootings and other disasters. The safe rooms will decrease these numbers and ease parents' peace of mind if something were to occur while at school.
14 15 16 17	Section 3: Currently, schools have virtually no safe places for students to go when disaster strikes. A lot of the time, they go into the hallway with protection at a minimum. These safe rooms would bring maximum security and hopefully prevent injuries and fatalities for students, faculty, and staff.
18 19 20 21 22	Section 4: Funding will come from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The cost would be approximately \$500,000 in new construction. This would include doors from every classroom to the safe area, stairs to the bottom, as well as concrete walls to ensure maximum safety. After FEMA approves this construction from each individual school, they will cover the cost.
