1 An act to provide classes for students of the same gender throughout Kentucky
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: Currently in Kentucky, mixed-gender schooling is widely practiced. This could cause some students
6 to be unengaged in their learning. Same-gender schooling encourages students to step out of their comfort
7 zone and take charge of their learning. Studies show that same-gender classes contribute to a more
8 comfortable learning environment and almost stress-free learning. In the year 2010, 78.2 percent of high
9 schoolers graduated on time in the U.S. However, same-gender schools report numbers even higher. Same
10 gender schools report numbers such as:

12 All male gender: 82%
13 All Female gender-- 100%

15 As you can see, the numbers presented by same-gender classrooms are considerably higher than 78.2
16 percent that is shown by a mixed-gender class.
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18 Section 2: All students in public schools will be put in the class with their same gender.
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20 Section 3: Each county's Board of Education will enforce this bill.
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22 Section 4: Consequences include state officials taking over the administration of the school.
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24 Section 5: This bill will go into effect at the start of the 2014-2015 school year.
