An act to allow private school tuition to become deductible up to \$5,000 per child a year.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: All parents or guardians that have a child or children enrolled in a private school will be able to deduct up to \$5,000 per child each year in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Section 2: A private school is a school supported by a private organization or private individuals rather than by the government.

Section 3: A deduction is an expense, such as a charitable contribution, that can be subtracted from one's taxable income.

Section 4: This deduction is applicable to all elementary and high schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Section 5: This bill will help alleviate the amount of taxes that parents have to pay, then these parents will reinvest this saved money back into the economy.

Section 6: This bill will be enforced by the KDR (Kentucky Department of Revenue) in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Section 7: There are no offenses to this bill because taxpayers have the option to apply for this deduction.

Section 8: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.

Section 9: This bill will go into effect at the start of the next school year after passage and signature by the Governor.
