1 An act to require all employees at daycares in Kentucky to be first-aid certified.

2  
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4  
5 Section 1: If this bill were passed, it would require all employees and workers at daycares across Kentucky to  
6 become certified in first-aid training. Over the last few years, Kentucky has had a large rise in the number of  
7 injuries and deaths of children in daycares. Our bill would prevent these injuries from being so severe, and  
8 lower the amount of deaths at daycares in Kentucky.

10 Section 2: All employees, including ones already working there, will be required to take the training either  
11 right before or right after they are employed. They will take the emergency first aid training course at the  
12 Red Cross location nearest to them, or take the course online. If an employee has taken a similar course  
13 before, they will have to retake this course.

14  
15 Section 3: If said employee refuses to participate in the training, they will be declined their job. All employees  
16 need to be certified for the safety of the children.

17  
18 Section 4: The employee will be paying for the training- they only need to take a simple first-aid type course,  
19 where prices start at \$30, which most employers will be able to pay for. If the employee can't pay for this,  
20 then the insurance company of the employee will.

21  
22 Section 5: To ensure that the daycares are following this law, the employer will keep all certificates and  
23 paperwork from the courses in a secure place. A worker from the Health and Family Services of Kentucky will  
24 randomly come and check the records. If the worker suspects that the records are false, then he/she will  
25 come back and have all workers take a test on the content over the content covered in the course.

26  
27 Section 6: If a daycare is found violating this law, after an infant or child becomes injured for a reason that  
28 could've been prevented, it will have to pay a fine.

- 29 • 1st Offense: \$250
- 30 • 2nd Offense: \$400
- 31 • 3rd Offense: \$550
- 32 • 4th Offense: Closure of daycare, until further inspection

33 If any daycare is accused of an infant or child die while being cared for by an uncertified employee, it shall be  
34 shut down immediately, and until further inspection.

35  
36 Section 7: This bill will be effective immediately after passage.
