An act to create an	animal abuse	registry

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: The purpose of our bill is to prevent serial counts of severe animal abuse by persons previously
convicted of this type of abuse. Our goal is to create a more humane environment for domesticated animals
in the state of Kentucky. This will make Kentucky a safer, more refined environment for pet owners.

9 Section 2: In Kentucky, people convicted of animal cruelty in the second degree may pay a fine of up to \$500.00, and/or potentially serve one year in prison, with minimal state prevention of further animal abuse after their prison time is served. We propose that these offenders be placed upon a registry of animal abuse offenders after prison time is served. Inclusion on this registry will prevent a person from purchasing or adopting any domesticated animal from a licensed vendor, pound, or animal adoption agency. This will minimize the numbers of offenders who become serial animal abusers.

Section 3: The Kentucky state police will be responsible for creating, and maintaining the registry. Pet stores, pounds, animal adoption agencies, and any other people who seek to legally sell a domesticated animal are responsible for checking for a potential customer's inclusion on the registry.

Section 4: This bill will not cost anything to enact. If offenders have been placed on the registry, but still manage to acquire or purchase a domesticated animal: First offense: Animal is confiscated, and placed in an animal adoption agency. The offender receives a warning. Second offense: Animal is revoked and put up for adoption. Offender is required to pay a \$200.00 fine. Third offense, and all subsequent offenses: Animal is revoked and put up for adoption. Offender is required to pay a \$500.00 fine.
