1 An act to require all schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to have an Epipen on site and individuals
2 trained to administer the injection.
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: At least two members of a school faculty will be required to be trained in administration of the
7 Epipen and to know the signs of anaphylactic shock. This training would be provided during the annual drug
8 administration training by registered nurse
9 .

10 Section 2: All students will be required to have a parent/guardian sign a liability waiver allowing for the
11 administration of the Epipen. The parent/guardian may choose for their child to opt out of receiving the
12 Epipen.

14 Section 3: Kentucky schools are already allowed to purchase and store Epipens and use them on students
15 who fall into life-threatening anaphylactic shock. This bill simply mandates this for all schools. The price for
16 Epipens for schools is \$112.00 each and each carton comes with two Epipen Auto-Injectors. Funding for
17 this act will come from 0.0002% of the state's total funding for all schools.

19 Section 4: This bill will go into effect in the 2014-2015 school year.
