1 2 3	An act to reward employers who hire veterans with a 10% state tax deduction that is evaluated from the annual salary of the veterans.
4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5	
6	Section 1: This bill will encourage employers to hire veterans. The incentive of hiring veterans seeking
7	employment will be a tax deduction of 10%. This deduction will be assessed from the annual salary of the
8	employed veterans. This deduction will be similar to a donation due to its non-taxable quality. These
9	veterans can be from any branch of military excluding those of dishonorable discharge.
10	
11	Section 2: Federal Government currently offers a point reference benefit of employers of veterans. With this
12	bill, employers will receive a benefit from the state by accumulating a non-taxable sum derived from the
13	employed veteran's annual salary.
14	
15	Section 3: Veterans often struggle with finding employment because often businesses fear the veterans will
16	not transition appropriately from military to civilian terms and businesses often refer to the stereotype that
17	military veterans are often too rigid for domestic work, among other reasons.
18	
19	Section 4: There are currently over 900,000 veterans in the United States who are without work. Upon
20	ratification of this bill, not only will this allow veterans to be more likely chosen for employment, but it also
21	rewards employers to make the patriotic choice for those who have fought for our freedoms we practice
22	daily.
23	

24 Section 5: This bill will go in to effect January 1, 2014.
