1 An act to put prisoners to work manual labor jobs.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: This bill would require prisoners to work manual labor jobs. (Jobs could include but are not limited
6 to road maintenance, harvesting tobacco, manual labor at construction sites, etc.)

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8 Section 2: The money made by the prisoners would go to straight to the State.

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10 Section 3: If a prisoner meets the goal and requirements of the job that they are assigned, then they will
11 receive \$3.25 hourly wage that the prisoner will receive after the prisoner serves his/her sentence or if the
12 prisoner chooses the money can got to family. In the case of a life sentence the money will be sent to
13 someone of the prisoner’s choosing.

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15 Section 4: This workforce will either be rented out to companies or local businesses that need their services.
16 The businesses will receive tax deductions for employing the prisoner workforce.

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18 Section 5: If not currently “employed”, then this workforce will work on public service projects (i.e. cleaning
19 highways, road work, cleaning up public areas, etc.)

20
21 Section 6: The prisoners will be monitored by the prison as well as hired professionals to oversee the
22 operations, to make sure the prisoners do a proper job, and to monitor safety.

23
24 Section 7: This bill will go into effect April 20, 2014.
