1 An act to restrict road work in Kentucky during heavy traffic periods.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: Restricting workers from working on roads during heavy traffic periods (most commonly in the
6 mornings and afternoons) will help ensure citizens the ability to arrive to their destinations on time.
7 Currently, road workers are often holding back citizens of Kentucky's commonwealth from reaching their
8 destinations on time. In some cases, this causes employees and students throughout the commonwealth to
9 be reprimanded for unexcused tardiness.

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11 Section 2: Restricting the time periods for road workers to perform construction will enhance citizens to
12 arrive to their destinations at a reasonable time. Workers will be scheduled to work at different times (such
13 as evenings and nights) to ensure fewer traffic collisions and an easier work flow. In addition, reducing the
14 intensity of traffic back ups will reduce gasoline consumption for individual vehicles as well as ultimately
15 lower levels of pollution.

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17 Section 3: Since road workers will most likely be working in evenings or during the nights, lighting will be
18 provided and will be paid by the tax foundation of Kentucky's commonwealth.

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20 Section 4: The road workers will be paid the same amount due to no change in their number of hours worked
21 per week.

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23 Section 5: This bill will be enacted six (6) months after its passage.
