1 An act to install Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs for providers in every pain clinic in Kentucky.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: This bill will require every pain clinic in Kentucky to install and use a Prescription Drug Monitoring
6 Program.
7
8 Section 2: This program will require every owner of every pain clinic to have this system, which monitors
9 each drug that is being sold to each consumer. The owners of the clinics will be expected to log the drugs
10 being sold at their clinic in proportion with how much they have at their clinic.
11
12 Section 3: Pill mills are often labeled as pain clinics, but they are not providing pain care. They are instead
13 illegally dispensing drugs to patients.
14
15 Section 4: Requiring a Drug Monitoring Program will be beneficial to stopping pill mills because the doctors
16 will have to log what drugs they are distributing and when. This will be a follow up to the already present
17 drug limitation laws.

19 Section 5: Each pain clinic will be expected to install this system by the enactment date. If they fail to do so,
20 the government will come to the pain clinic and evaluate the situation. This will ultimately result in every pain
21 clinic having and using the system.

23 Section 6: If found guilty of illegally distributing these drugs, the offender will immediately be sentenced to
24 prison and the pain clinic will be shut down.
25
26 Section 7: The US Drug Enforcement Administration will ensure that every pain clinic has this system, and
27 have random checks to ensure the system is being properly used.
28
29 Section 8: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2015.
