1                                   An act to legalize the use of recreational marijuana in the state of Kentucky

3                                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5   Section 1: This act will allow for persons the age of 21 and over to possess up to two ounces of marijuana  
6 without penalties.

7

8   Section 2: The penalty for underage use, over-possession, and driving while under the influence of marijuana  
9 will be the same as the penalties for underage use, over-possession, and driving while under the influence of  
10 alcohol.

12   Section 3: Any businesses wishing to distribute recreational marijuana must purchase a \$250 license to  
13 produce, process and sell. Permits will be distributed by the Kentucky Department of Alcohol Beverage  
14 Control.

16   Section 4: A 15 percent tax will be levied on the sale, which will go towards substance-abuse prevention  
17 programs.

19   Section 5: Money saved from the current enforcement of marijuana laws, such as arrests, housing of  
20 criminals, and prosecution in Kentucky courts, will be added to the general Kentucky budget.

22   Section 6: This bill will take effect January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014.
