1 An act to prohibit those convicted of DUIs from purchasing alcohol in the state of Kentucky.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: People age twenty-one and older who are found to be driving with a blood alcohol content greater
6 than or equal to 0.08 will be issued a special non-driver's identification card that shows they have been
7 prohibited from purchasing alcohol. The offender will be required to hold this card until he or she is reissued
8 his or her driver's license and have been granted driving privileges. The amount of time the offender's driver's
9 license is revoked (and the length of time the offender will be prohibited from purchasing alcohol) will be
10 determined by the Circuit Court.

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12 Section 2: The new non-driver's identification cards will be designed by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet
13 in a way that makes them easy to distinguish from regular non-driver's identification cards.

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15 Section 3: Any additional expenses resulting from this bill (including the cost of the identification cards) will
16 be factored into the fines paid by the offender. The fines will be determined by the circuit court.

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18 Section 4: Businesses holding alcohol licenses will be notified of the new policies but in place by this law by
19 the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet.

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21 Section 5: All parts of this law will be enforced by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, the Circuit Courts,
22 and county Circuit Clerks.

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24 Section 6: All parts of this bill will be carried out in compliance with Statute KRS 189A.010.

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26 Section 7: This bill will go into effect six months following passage.
