1 An act to require sexual education curriculum in public high schools

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1:

6 This bill will not require any extra funding from public school systems

7
8 Section 2:

9 This bill will not be enacted at the beginning of the following school year (the 2014-2015 term)

11 Section 3:

12 High Schools may include this curriculum as one of the following:

13
14 (A) a nine-week standalone course taught by a certified instructor in the field

16 -OR-

18 (B) a nine week block as part of an already required health and PE course taught by the health and PE
19 instructor

21 Section 4: Parts of the curriculum are already in existence in the form of the Reducing the Risk program.
22 Additional curriculum must also be non-abstinence based and include education on the following:

- 23
24 - Safe sex practice
25 - Abortion
26 - Sexually transmitted diseases and infections
27 - Pregnancy
28 - Conception and contraception
29 - The gender spectrum and sexuality spectrum
30 - sexual abuse and how to recognize it
31 - tips for creating healthy sexual relationships

33 Section 5: Students religiously or otherwise opposed to this curriculum may submit an application for opting
34 out of the class. Once the application is reviewed by school officials and verified as truthful, the student will
35 be enrolled in an alternate independent class where material does not conflict with their values
