1 An act to enforce all FDA-approved manufacturers to list all chemical pesticides used throughout processing.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Presently in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, manufacturers and processors are not required to
6 label the chemical pesticides used in producing and processing. We want all chemical pesticides to be listed
7 out as we have a right to know what goes into our bodies.

9 Section 2: Common chemical pesticides used are Organophosphate, Carbamate, Organochlorine, and
10 Pyrethroid which are carcinogenic as well as common factors for other serious health issues.

12 Section 3: Funding for this will be very minimal since this only requires the manufacturer to print a small
13 disclaimer in the nutritional information. However, funding will be needed to pay inspectors for doing an
14 additional task of checking chemical pesticides used. This will come from violation fees as well as the FDA

16 Section 4: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2015 or the year after it has been passed. Violaters will
17 receive a notice to abide. Failure to do so will result in a nominal fine that goes towards paying inspectors.
