1                   An act to Change the Revoke period of Biological Parents in an adoption

3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: In order to protect the best interest of the adoptive child, the revoke period should be lowered  
6 from 20 days to 10 days. This will repeal the Kentucky Revised Statutes(1998), Sections 199.470 to  
7 199.590.

9 Section 2: The cost of this bill will include the accrued expenses paid by the adoptive parents and are  
10 normally associated with adoption. These expenses can include but not subject to doctor's bills, attorney  
11 fees, and other expenses. These expenses would be under the direction of the adoption agency and  
12 determined by the adoptive parents and the biological parents.

14 Section 3: During the 10 day revoke period, the child will remain in the care of the adoptive parents and  
15 under the supervision of the adoption agency. If no legal reply has been received by the adoptive parents  
16 within this 10 day period, the child will automatically be remanded into the custody of the adoptive parents.  
17 \* Stipulation, if either of the biological parents (father and/or mother) commit a felony offense within the  
18 revoke period, the child will automatically be remanded to the custody of the adoptive parents.

19  
20 Section 4: This proposal will be enacted January 1, 2014.
