12	Section 2: The tax credit given is 30% off of the original cost of the installation of the system. This credit is
13	specifically used as an incentive for hotels to install hotel power card systems into their respective hotels.

15	incentive to save energy in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

25	is to have an incentive for hotels to essentially invest in theirselves; which saves the hotel money and energy
25 26	costs. In addition to lower energy costs for the hotel, the price for people to stay in that hotel would
27	typically decrease, benefitting the economy.

29	Section 5: The main focus of this bill is not for the government to profit money, but to stimulate the
