1 An act to allow Kentucky minors ages 15 and up to apply for a Class H (Hardship) License.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: The Class H (Hardship) license is a restricted License issued administratively in accordance with
6 statues or by order of the court to the applicant, in this case ages 15 and up. This license allows the
7 applicant to drive during the period of hardship in order to help immediate family earn a livelihood and to
8 maintain the necessities of life.

10 Section 2: This bill pertains to Kentucky citizens ages 15 and up

11
12 Section 3: In order to obtain the Class H License, the applicant must complete 40 total driving hours being
13 30 day and 10 night hours. Individuals applying for the Class H License must have proof of hardship being
14 written documentation from a lawyer, doctor, or specialist stating proof of condition on which it is needed.

16 Section 4: This bill if passed will be of no cost to Kentucky citizens. The applicant will be responsible for the
17 standard fee of 20.00 to obtain the driving license.

18
19 Section 5: There are a few penalties especially for the safety and concern of our minors. The license will be
20 revoked if guilty of the following: failure to complete No Pass, No Drive standards, and failure to abide by
21 already standing driving laws. Revocation will also occur if stated conditionals and requirements in section 3
22 are not followed.

23
24 Section 6: This bill will go into effect in March of 2014.
