An act to require all public high schools to offer Theology as an elective course.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: A Theology class will be set as an elective and does not have to be taken by all students. It will maintain "religious neutrality". Students will learn about different religious literature, criticism, and methods and interpretations.

Section 2: No additional funding will be required. The course will be taught by a high school teacher who is currently employed to teach elective courses.

Section 3: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education. KDE will ensure that every school district is offering Theology as an elective course in high school.

Section 4: This bill will go into effect with the 2014-15 school year.
