1 2 3	An act to require social workers to approve home conditions for new parents (birth to six months of age) who have a violent felony record.
4 5	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
6 7 8	Section 1: Definition of Violent Felon: Anyone convicted in a state court of law of a domestic violence crime, child abuse, or other defined felony violent crimes under Kentucky state law.
9 10 11 12	Section 2: Funding: This would just be characterized as a home check by social workers so social services are already paying them. No additional funding would be needed to employ the program since the bill targets a small population of violent felons.
13 14 15 16 17 18	Section 3: Specifications: If the home situation does not fit certain codes (county/city building codes, health codes) then a two-month grace period will be given to fix the violation of codes. If the guardian fails to amend violations after the two-month period passes then the child will be temporarily placed with a fit relative until the guardian files for reevaluation as a fit parent to the social worker. If there is no fit relative then the child will be placed in foster care until standards are met. Excess negligence will result in the child being taken as a ward of the state.
