- 1 An act to provide candidate information and statistics on statewide elections at polling stations.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

- 5 Section 1: The purpose of this bill is to provide voting citizens with factual statistics and information about
6 each candidate for any level of election so that the voter will have the encouraged opportunity to make an
7 educated vote. A website, pamphlets, and/or a slideshow (to be made by the Kentucky Board of Elections to
8 avoid bias) will be provided at each polling station, so that accurate information can be provided to the
9 general public. Currently, voting citizens can enter a poll both and vote for a candidate, without knowing
10 anything about the candidate's politics.

- 12 Section 2: This bill, while not forcing voters to acknowledge the resources, highly encourages citizens to get
13 to know the candidates, their positions, and choices they made if they served a term in another office earlier.

- 15 Section 3: The Kentucky Board of Elections will fund the materials (A website, pamphlets, and/or a
16 slideshow) needed to educate voters about the candidates.

- 18 Section 4: This bill will go in affect in the next election period in Kentucky as soon as it is passed.
