1 An act to create a standardized grading scale for all publicly-funded K-12 Kentucky schools
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: All publicly-funded K-12 schools in Kentucky must use the same grading scale.
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7 Section 2: This policy will go into effect at the beginning of the new school year.

9 a.) The new grading scale will be the ten-point system.
10 EX: 90-100=A, 80-89=B, 70-79=C, 60-69=D, Below 60=F

12 b.) Students' grades from previous years shall not be required to be converted to the new scale.
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14 Section 3: Being as the ten-point system is used by many K-12 schools and colleges in Kentucky, this
15 grading scale is the optimal choice for Kentucky schools to use.

17 Section 4: The Kentucky Board of Education shall adopt regulations to effectuate this bill.
