1 An act to further prevent safer driving in the Commonwealth of Kentucky .

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Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

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Section I: Recently the Commonwealth has undertaken a policy of no “distracted driving” extending to no texting or calling while driving. This bill recognizes that hazards still exist and commonly as causal for accidents – thus not completely deterring the original problem. This bill says that Kentucky ought to also end the use of “Bluetooth” and other wireless devices that allow texting and calling while driving. This bill will be enacted through taxes and fines to dealerships that do not rid their lots of cars with these capabilities and to owners of these vehicles who refuse to pay for the removal of these devices.

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Section II: This bill is largely attempting to further rid the Commonwealth of Kentucky from driver distraction (i.e. fewer wrecks and accidents). This bill is simply a safety and precaution mechanism.

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Section III: The Kentucky Government will supply the funds for the removal of these devices from persons’ vehicles IF said person can prove that their economic prowess is not sufficient to pay for the removal.

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Section IV: The funding for this bill will come from the annual budget of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and the Department of Driver Safety (DDS).

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Section V: This bill will go into effect upon passage.

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
