1 An act to prohibit the carrying of firearms in all public Kentucky business places.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: No person or persons shall enter a public business place with a firearm.
6
7 Section 2: Public business places and establishments shall be defined as an establishment where business is
8 orchestrated, where goods are processed and services are provided.
9
10 Section 3: An exemption to this law shall be granted to all on-duty local, state, and federal law enforcement
11 officers.

13 Section 4: All state laws and policies, or portions of state laws and policies, that conflict with the provisions
14 of this bill are hereby repealed.
15
16 Section 5: This bill shall decree that if a person or persons enter a public business place or establishment
17 with a firearm they shall be forced to pay a fine of \$200-\$1,000. For a second offense of this crime there
18 will be a fine with a possibility of jail time ranging from 6 months-5 years.

20 Section 6: This bill shall go into effect January 6, 2014.
