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- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 5 Section 1: In order to be college or career ready and productive citizens, students need to be proficient in
- 6 other world languages.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: All students will have consistent and strategic instruction in a foreign language each year grades
- 9 K-5. Instruction can be computer based or directly face-to-face. Instruction will be no less than 30 minutes
- 10 per week.

- 12 Section 3: Costs could be as little as a computer software program around \$100.00. Some districts may
- 13 choose to hire a certified, highly qualified teacher.

- 15 Section 4: Upon passage, this bill will become law in September 2014.
