- 1 An act to require schools in Kentucky that do not have Guidance Counselors to implement a peer mediation
- 2 program.
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- 4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 6 Section 1: A peer mediation group is a program where students of the same age-group
- 7 facilitate disputes between two individuals of small groups.
- 8
- 9 Section 2: Peer mediators do not "make decisions or enforce discipline" but help each side avoid further
- 10 problems.
- 11
- 12 Section 3: Types of problems that may benefit from peer mediation are: social media problems, relationship
- 13 difficulties, gossip and rumors, and minor bullying incidents. More serious problems may require an
- 14 administrator, such as: assault, drug use, bullying, sexual abuse, suicide, weapon possession, and others
- 15 that involve legal issues.

- 17 Section 4: The cost will be minimum, less than \$100.00 per school.
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- 19 Section 5: Upon passage, this bill will become law in May 2014.
