1 An act to expand student lunch options so that students have improved choices

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: Students are wasting school lunch food due to lack of preferred foods.
6
7 Section 2: Each school year, students would be surveyed to determine a variety of lunch options to serve in
8 the cafeteria.
9
10 Section 3: A variety of seasonal fruits and vegetables will be included, not just apples and oranges.
11
12 Section 4: The survey must be completed by the second Friday of the school year. If it is not completed
13 within the first 30 days of school, a penalty would result.
14
15 Section 5: The penalty would be a fine of \$1.00 per student enrolled at the school.
16
17 Section 6: Parents and students could report non-compliant schools to their state representatives. The
18 representatives will visit the school to address the non-compliance.
19
20 Section 7: This bill shall be mandatory for all schools by the 2015-2016 school year. It will be optional, to
21 run on a trial basis, during the 2014-2015 school year.
