1 An act to require all high school students to perform ten hours of community service each year of high  
2 school.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5  
6 Section 1: This act applies to all high school students of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. This act requires all  
7 high school students to perform ten hours of community service each year enrolled in a Kentucky high school  
8 for a total of 40 hours.  
9

10 Section 2: The bill will be of no cost to the state and school. The monitoring will be through the students  
11 individual learning plan (ILP) which students are already required to complete yearly.  
12

13 Section 3: If the student does not complete the required amount of community service, the student's penalty  
14 will consist of being unable to graduate. Some students may be excluded from the requirement based on  
15 special needs.  
16

17 Section 4: This act will be in effect for the students entering high school in 2016; graduating class of 2020.  
18 Students entering Kentucky schools from other states will be required to complete 10 hours per year  
19 completed in a Kentucky school.
