- 1 An act to to require mandatory rehabilitation for convicted opiate pharmaceutical abusers
- 2
- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: People convicted of first time drug offense for abusing opiates or pharmaceuticals will be required
- 6 to go to a drug rehabilitation clinic for one month. Drug abusers who have bee arrested two or more times
- 7 will be required to go to a rehabilitation clinic for six months.
- 8
- 9 Section 2: Payment for rehabilitation will come from a variety of sources. Bail money from convicted drug
- 10 abusers will go toward rehabilitation costs. This will be combined with insurance and out of pocket cost.
- 11 Those who are below the poverty line will utilize free rehabilitation centers and work out payment methods.
- 12
- 13 Section 3: If rehabilitation centers are full, convicted drug abusers will spend their time in jail until vacancies
- 14 are available. This time will be deducted from their total mandated rehabilitation.
- 15
- 16 Section 4: Addicts who do not comply with this bill will serve additional mandated time in jail.
- 17
- 18 Section 5: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2015.
