| 1 2 | An act to repeal privileges to operate a handheld device while operating a motor vehicle. |

| - 3 4 | Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky |
| 5 6 7 | Section 1: To repeal all Kentuckians' privilege to operate a handheld device while operating a motor vehicle in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. |
| , 8 9 | Section 2: All Kentuckians above the age of sixteen (16) who operate a motor vehicle will abide by this law. |
| 10 11 | Section 3: A motor vehicle is anything that has wheels, an engine, and is street-legal. |
| 12 13 | Section 4: A hands free device is anything that resides in your car that you don't need hands to use. |
| 14 15 16 | Section 5: A handheld device is a pocket-sized computing device that typically has a display screen and/or has a miniature keyboard. |
| 17 18 | Section 6: This will help decrease the accident rates in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. |
| 19 20 | Section 7: This bill will have no cost. |
| 21 22 | Section 8: This bill will be enforced by the state and county police of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. |
| 23 24 | Section 9: Kentuckians that fail to abide by this law will be punished as follows: |
| 25 26 27 28 29 | 1st Offence: This driver will be fined \$150 by the state or county police of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. 2nd Offence: This driver will be fined \$500 by the state or county police of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. 3rd Offence: This Kentuckian will be fined \$1,000 and their licenses will be revoked. This offence will be repeated until the Kentuckian abides by the law. |
| 30 31 | Section 10: All laws or parts of laws that are in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed. |
| 32 | Section 11: This bill will go into effect ninety (90) days after passage and signature of the governor. " |
