1                   An act to implement a safety plan for all public middle and high schools in that state.  
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3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
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5 Section 1: All students will be required to go through a metal detector check before entrance into the  
6 building. These checks take less than one minute per student and only go off when exposed to high metals.  
7 Things like bracelets and jewelry will not go off. If a student arrives to school late they will still have to go  
8 through the metal detector. Any outside visitors will have to as well.  
9  
10 Section 2: Each county will be required to hire a resource officer. Resource officers are trained police officers  
11 that are on school campuses. They are more qualified than a regular guard.  
12  
13 Section 3: These two plans will assure that students would be more safe.  
14  
15 Section 4: This bill will go in effect January 1, 2014
