1                   An act to ensure the Reduction of Crime Rates in the Commonwealth of Kentucky

3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: As the population increases so does the crime rate. This is a huge problem in our society. For  
6 example, in 2009 the crime rate rose 45% compared to the 13% in most of the other states. It is our goal  
7 to lower the crime rates by at least 15%.  
8  
9 Section 2: Crime rate is the ratio of crime to population in a particular area. In Kentucky, out of every 1000  
10 people, 30 of them will commit a crime.  
11  
12 Section 3: The ways we want to reduce crime rates is to create more security everywhere, create stricter  
13 laws, and more street lamps with cameras.  
14  
15 Section 4: The funding to support this would come from several things including doubling the alcohol taxes,  
16 and making prisoners pay for their meals and electricity through manual labor, in order to cut the prison  
17 funding to go toward cutting the crime rate.  
18  
19 Section 5: We would want this act to go into effect of January 2015.
